7 Practical Tips for Parents of Teens

- 1. Begin conversations early.
- 2. Stay current with what's trending.
- 3. Write an acceptable use contract.
- 4. Occasionally look up your child and see what is posted about them or by them.
- 5. Teach your teen to set up safe passwords.
- 6. Teach the basics of using kindness and respect even online.
- 7. Encourage your kids to report inappropriate behavior.



12 Apps Every Parent Should Know



- **AskFM** encourages users to allow anonymous people to ask them questions. Known for cyber bullying.
- **GroupMe** used to create group chats & linked to email or phone #; GIFs & emojis have adult themes.
- **HIP** "**H**ide **I**t **P**ro"; Appears to be a music app but is for hiding photos & text messages.
- **Houseparty** allows groups of teens to connect by live video. Screenshots can be taken.
- **kik messenger** Allows anyone to contact & direct msg. Kids can bypass traditional text msg features.
- **LiveMe** live-streaming video app that uses geolocation to share a video. "Users" can earn "coins" as a way to pay minors for photos.
- **Omegle** chat site that puts two strangers together in their choice of a text or video chat
- Vault has the ability to hide photos and videos on the phone for storage
- WeChat calling & msg service with a location-sharing feature to find other users in the area.
- WhatsApp msg app with voice ability. Allows user to enter code to "lock" chat.
- Whisper anonymous social network that promotes sharing secrets with strangers. Reveals user's location so people can "meetup".
- **Yubo** Tinder for Teens (13-17) to find new friends by photos & live video stream. App has location tracking built in.
